posal from the consulting firm of Barnett, Stuart and Dow Inc. which proposal sets out maximum prices for geology of six specific bridges to be constructed in Douglas County, Kansas. Following review of the proposal it was moved by Mr. Stoneback that this proposal be approved, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously. A copy of the proposal is on file in the commission office.

At 1:30 p.m. as advertised, the Board opened bids which had been received for the purchase of 2,000 gallons of amine 2,4-D for the Douglas County Noxious Weed Department. Fifteen bids were bids with the apparent low bidder being the Colorado International Corporation in the amount of \$10,624. Following complete discussion it was moved by Mr. Stoneback that we request Mr. Duver, noxious weed supervisor, to review the bids received and report his findings to the Board, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.

Ted McFarlane, Douglas County Ambulance Service Manager, presented to the Board financial summary of the Douglas County Ambulance Service as of July 31, 1976.

Gerald Cooley, attorney for the City of Lawrence, requested the setting of a hearing date to consider a petition from the City of Lawrence for an order vacating a certain street described as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of Lot 7, Crossgates No. 2, an addition to the City of Lawrence, Kansas, thence south 57.65 feet, thence on a curve to the left having a radius of 60 feet, a distance of 94.25 feet, said point being on the north line of 25th Street, Lawrence, Kansas, thence west 120.30 feet, thence north 117.95 feet to the north line of said addition, thence east 60 feet to the point of beginning. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that a hearing date on this matter be set for 10:00 a.m., August 30, 1976, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Robert Duver, noxious weed supervisor, reported to the Board that following review of bids received on August 16, 1976, for 2,000 gallons of amine 2,4-D for use by his department, he recommended the acceptance by the Board of the bid from Colorado International Corporation which was the low bid in the amount of \$10,624. It was moved by Mr. Whitenight that the Board accept Mr. Duver's recommendation, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Duver recommended to the Board that in accord with state statutes and giving consideration to the recent purchase price of 2,4-D, that the sale of 2,4-D to qualified users be reduced from \$4.50 to \$4.25 per gallon. It was moved by Mr. Whitenight that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

The Board noted receipt of a certificate from the chairman of the Judicial Council of Kansas Certifying that Sherlyn Sampson, clerk of district court, had reported 2,199 cases for which she is entitled ten cents per case for a total of \$219.90. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that this statement be approved for payment, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.
