Al Skeet, maintenance supervisor, recommended to the Board that following review of the bids received for janitorial services in the new judicial and law enforcement building, the annual base bid of IT&T Building Services be accepted in the amount of \$20,025 with an additional sum of \$2,399.88 representing Alternate No. 1 in the specifications for a total annual fee of \$22,424.88, and that Alternate No. 2 be held in abeyance pending determination of need. Mr. Skeet further recommended that Item No. 5 on Page 3 of 4 of the specifications be eliminated as a required service. It was moved by Mr. Whitenight that the Board accept the recommendations with service to begin on October 28, 1976, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.
