After lengthy discussion and telephone conversation with Mr. Joe Barnett of Barnett, Stuart and Dow and Mr. Ray Olson, state highway department, it was mutually agreed that we would project the concept of a 3-party agreement between Douglas County, the state highway department, and Barnett, Stuart, and Dow, to secure federal participation in the necessary geology for Clinton Parkway.

The Board considered Resolution No. 76-43 which resolution relates to granting a cereal malt beverage license to Robert G. Nixon for use at the Midland Farm Store, Route 3, Lawrence, Kansas. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that this resolution be adopted, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.

Clinton Pkwy:  
Geology study

Referring back to the minutes of December 23, the Board further discussed the question of geology for Clinton Parkway. Further discussion on the matter between representatives of the consultants, Barnett, Stuart and Dow and the State Highway Department have indicated that too great a delay would be caused by seeking federal participation through a 3-party agreement. After considering these new facts it was moved by Mr. Whitenight that the geologic investigation and report agreement on Clinton Parkway Project No. 23-AHL-1593 (3) be executed. The indicated maximum price in this agreement would be \$40,000. It is understood that this cost would be shared by the City of Lawrence and Douglas County on an approximate 30 to 70 percent split with the exact cost to be determined upon completion of the borings which the agreement projects to take approximately 45 to 60 days, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.
