The Board noted receipt of a letter from John C. Irwin, P.E., Chief Occupational Health Section Bureau of Air Quality and Occupational Health. In sum, this letter indicates that based on this department's findings, it is their opinion that it is unlikely that the existing ventilation system in the firing range is adequate to prevent the exposure of individuals using the range to significant quantities of airborne lead compounds. After review of this letter the Board agreed to send a copy to the building architects for their review and subsequent discussion.
