1. Irl Tessendorf from \$3.46/hr to \$3.63/hr, a 5% raise, effective 6/1/77, 3 year increase.
2. James Boyle from \$3.00/hr to \$3.21/hr, a 7% raise, effective 6/1/77, 6 month increase.
3. Sinda Onions from \$3.15/hr to \$3.31/hr, a 5% raise, effective 6/1/77, 1 year increase.
4. Cindy Vance from \$3.15/hr to \$3.24/hr, a 3% raise, effective 7/1/77, 1 year increase.
5. Jere McElhaney from \$3.00/hr to \$3.21/hr, a 7% raise, effective 7/1/77, 6 month increase.
6. Kathy Lawrence from \$3.20/hr to \$3.36/hr, a 5% raise, effective 7/1/77, 6 month increase.

Ted McFarlane also presented the Board quotes for the purchase of a sofa to be used in the employees lounge at the ambulance service. The quotes are from Thompson Furniture, Inc. for a 87 inch Kroehler sofa at \$350 net, and from Miller Furniture for a 90 inch Kroehler sofa for a price of \$350 net. Mr. McFarlane recommends the acceptance of the quote from Miller Furniture. After review it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be accepted and purchase be made from Miller Furniture, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed with Mr. McFarlane the sealed bids which were taken on 8 June 1977 for a heart monitor-defibrillator as new equipment for the ambulance service. Mr. McFarlane recommends the acceptance of the bid of American Optical, Inc. in the amount of \$4,420 which is next to the low bid. The choice of this particular piece of equipment over that of the low bidder is based on unique characteristics which this equipment offers and is not offered by the low bid. Mr. McFarlane points out that of the total price of \$4,420 a total of \$2,100 will be reimbursed to the county by MARCER under our 1976-77 HEW EMS Grant. After a complete review of Mr. McFarlane's recommendation it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that the bid of American Optical, Inc. in the amount of \$4,420 be accepted, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.

Tom McGee, engineering division manager, appeared before the Board to present a utility agreement on Bridge Project No. 05.00N-18.18E between the United Telephone Company of Kansas, Inc. and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County which agreement indicates that in accordance with provisions of K.S.A. 17-1901 that the company will move if necessary its facilities within the county right-of-way as made necessary by this project. The agreement also indicates that relocation of existing facilities which are currently located on private easements will be paid for by Douglas County and that if any alterations of the company facilities are required that they shall be completed within thirty days after the county furnishes notices to the company. After complete review of this document it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that this utility agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.
