Mr. Rogers requested a one-year salary increase for Mary Pritchett and Sue Hornsby. Ted McFarlane, Manager of the Douglas County Ambulance Service, appeared before the Board to request the following merit increases for employees in his service:

- (1) Gregg Crossman a 4% merit raise from \$3.30 to \$3.43/hour effective November 1, 1977, 2 year anniversary.
- (2) Dale Creed a 7% merit raise from \$3.15 to \$3.37/hour effective November 1, 1977, 1 year anniversary.
- (3) Ernest W. Karlin a 5% merit raise from \$3.14 to \$3.30/hour effective November 1, 1977, 1 year anniversary.
- (4) John Toczykowski a 4.5% merit raise from \$3.00 to \$3.14/hour effective November 1, 1977, 6 month anniversary.
- (5) James Boyle a 7% merit raise from \$3.21 to \$3.44/hour effective December 1, 1977, 1 year anniversary.

After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that they be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

The Board approved monthly fee reports for the following county offices: Sheriff, County Clerk, Public Works Department, Register of Deeds, and the Seventh Judicial District of Kansas.

The Board noted receipt of minutes from the public health committee for September 15, 1977, including the financial statement, nursing and clinical activities, sanitarian's monthly activity report, and environmental health report.
