Ernest Coleman, federal funds consultant, appeared before the Board to recommend the acceptance of two revenue sharing contracts. The first of these contracts is in the amount of \$4200 between the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County and the Douglas County Drug Abuse Council for the year 1978. Since that council has now acquired professional staff and has regenerated itself, the Board agrees to execute this contract, therefore, it was moved by Mr. Neis that the contract for \$4200 with Douglas County Drug Abuse Council be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously. The 1977 remaining contract balance of approximately \$1744.48 is to be voided.

The second contract presented by Mr. Coleman is between the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County and the Douglas County Committee on Alcoholism in the amount of \$10,500 for the year 1978. It was agreed by the Board to accept the request of Mr. Bruce Beale, who is the director for the committee on alcoholism, that \$2,000 of this amount be held in abeyance until such time as the committee on alcoholism requests its use for the preparation of a new half-way house for the purpose of providing and service. The remaining \$8,500 is to be paid in two installments and to be used for the committee's operating expenses. After complete review it was moved by Mr. Neis that this contract be approved as specified, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously. Mr. Coleman points out that \$4,250 of this amount shall be payable in January 1978.
