The Board reviewed a Memorandum of Understanding between the Fisheries Division of the Kansas Forestry, Fish and Game Commission and the Board of Doug-Memory Understand - las County Commission with reference to the management of recreational fishing between fisht ing on Lone Star Lake. The basic interest of the document is to strengthen Same Command the cooperative approach to the management of the fishery of Lone Star Lake and to create a mechanism whereby information regarding the management of the fishery program with regard to this lake should be communicated between the two parties of this memorandum. The memorandum includes the number of committments on the part of the Kansas Forestry, Fish and Game Commission and on the part of the County and a number of mutual agreements between the parties. After a complete review it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that this Memorandum of Understanding be executed, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously. In connection with this Memorandum of Understanding the Board forwards a letter to Mr. Mike Bronoski of the Kansas Forestry, Fish & Game Commission which requests an evaluation by him and the commission services generally of Lone Star Lake as a recreational fishing habitat.

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Effective as of 1 January 1978 the arrangement which existed with Kenneth Markley for him to be paid the figure of \$25 per month for opening the gate at Wells Park shall cease. Mr. Markley has chosen to no longer provide this service to Douglas County and therefore this small compensation will no longer be rendered.

The Board considered a recommendation from Administrative Judge James. W. Paddock. The recommendation from the administrative judge is as follows. First, that to replace the position which was vacated by Colt Knutson, there be hiring of an individual to serve as a probation officer one-half time on adult probation matters and one-half time on juvenile matters. This position to be salaried at approximately \$9,000 per year. The second recommendation is that an attorney be hired on a contract basis at an approxmate annual rate with attorney office of \$7,500 to serve as a "juvenile prosecutor". A meeting was held with Administrative Judge Paddock; Judy Osburn, Director of Court Services; and Mike Malone, County Attorney, to discuss these recommendations with the Board. After complete discussion it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that the first recommendation be approved as stated and that regarding the second recommendation, that this position of "juvenile prosecutor" be established within the County Attorney's office as an additional one-half time Assistant County Attorney whose function will be limited strictly to the services of the juvenile court as a presenter of cases before the juvenile court. This new position of Assistant County Attorney for juvenile matters will be advertised and filled through the normal hiring practices of the County Attorney's office , and it shall be clearly understood that it is not this Board's intention that this individual serve in any other capacity than as a liaison to the juvenile court from the County Attorney's office. In other words, this individual shall function through the County Attorney's office but is intended only to serve the juvenile court. This motion seconded by Mr. Neis and carried unanimously. It is understood that a job description for this position will be mutually developed by Ms. Osburn, Director of Court Services, and Mike Malone, County Attorney, and a copy of that description will be reviewed and approved by this commission and will remain on file in the commission office.
