Dean Sanderson, public works director, appeared before the Board to present a utility agreement on Project No. 11.40N-19.00E between The Kansas Power & Light Company and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County which agreement relates to provisions of K.S.A. 17-1901 as to the necessity for movement of utility equipment and facilities which are located on county right-of-way. The agreement indicates that relocation of existing facilities which are currently located on private easement will be paid for by Douglas County and that those facilities within county right-of-way will be moved at utility company expense, and that the construction or alterations of the company's facilities shall be completed within thirty days after the county furnishes to the company the required information. After review of this agreement it was moved by Mr. Neis that this utility agreement be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

31,000 gal. 2,4-D for

Bob Duver, noxious weed director, appeared before the Board to recommend the publishing of a notice to bidders on the purchase of 31,000 gallons of 2,4-D by the Douglas, Franklin, Johnson, and Shawnee County Noxious Weed Departments which bids will be received at the office of the office of the Shawnee County Noxious Weed Department until 10:00 a.m., CST, February 24, 1978, and then publicly opened in that office by the Shawnee County purchasing agent. It is recommended that this notice be published in the Lawrence Journal World on the 8th and 15th of February 1978. It is understood that of this 31,000 gallons it is Douglas County's intention to purchase 8,000 gallons, 4,000 gallons to be delivered on March 28 and 4,000 gallons to be delivered on April 28, 1978. After discussion on this recommendation it was moved by Mr. Neis that this notice to bidders be so published, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.
