Bob Duver, noxious weed director, appeared before the Board to recommend the publication of a notice to bidders that sealed bids will be received for the purchase of a one ton truck for the noxious weed department. These sealed bids will be received at the Office of the Director of Noxious Weeds, or the Office of the Director of Public Works, until 10:00 a.m., C.D.T., on October 2, 1978, and then publicly opened in the office of the Douglas County Board of Commissioners. It is recommended that this notice be published on September 20 and 27, 1978. After a brief review it was moved by Mr. Neis that this notice be so published, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

Mr. Duver then recommended to the Board that it accept the low bid from Mid-States Agricultural Chemical Company, Olathe, Kansas, for Douglas County's share of 2,000 gallons of 2,4-D chemical to be used in the noxious weed department at a net price of \$11,560. After brief discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

Jim Williams architect of the firm Peters, Williams & Kubota, appeared before the Board to present a status report of the progress on the remodeling project of the Douglas County Courthouse. He indicates, amongst other things, that the bids for moving the offices back into that building would be received on October 5, 1978.

At the conclusion of the report Mr. Williams presented a statement for Special Services for B. A. Green Construction Co., Inc., for the Judicial and Law Enforcement Center, to furnish and install 3/8" clear Lexan in bronze aluminum frame at Room 280 at a net price of \$1,820. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this amount be paid from the commissioners economic contingency line item, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

(1) Between Harold M. Houk, a single person, Russel V. Houk & Betty J. Houk, Hazel M. Wise & Bernard W. Wise, Ralph G. Houk & Bette Houk, and Clifford W. Houk & Phyllis I. Houk, and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County. This contract provides for a lump sum payment of \$900 for 0.21 acres of right-of-way, 0.06 acres temporary easement for construction, 38 rods of woven fence and includes allowance for temporary fence and abstracting.

(2) Between Harold M. Houk, a single person, Russel V. Houk & Betty J. Houk, Hazel M. Wise & Bernard W. Wise, Ralph G. Houk & Bette Houk, and Clifford W. Houk & Phyllis I. Houk, and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County. This contract provides for a lump sum payment of \$4,500 for 1.60 acres of right-of-way easement, 174 rods of barb fence, and includes allowance for irregularity of fencing, very irregular permanent boundary abstracting, and 1/3 of 0.75 acres of corn crop.

(3) Between Harold M. Houk, a single person, Russel V. Houk & Betty J. Houk, Hazel M. Wise & Bernard W. Wise, Ralph G. Houk & Bette Houk, and Clifford W. Houk & Phyllis I. Houk, and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County. This contract provides for a lump sum payment of \$7,000 for 4.97 acres of right-of-way easement, 0.44 acres temporary easement for construction, 9 rods of woven fence, 78 rods barb fence, approximately 11 rods temporary fence and includes allowance for irregular fencing, very irregular permanent boundary, abstracting, 1/3 of 2.5 acres of corn crop and 1/3 of 1.0 acres of wheat crop.
