Valleyview : Anterested persons discussed future of home maise.

The Board met with Ms. Petey Cerf, a representative of KINH, and Jessie Branson, Eleanor Smith, and Harriet Nehring to discuss the status of Valleyview Nursing Home. This group reviewed the current physical condition of the home and proposed to the Board that a new facility should be built and that it should be in the skilled care classification, and that the current home should be converted to providing care for ambulatory persons. After a lengthy discussion the Board agreed to take the matter under advisement and submit the reports received to the Valleyview Advisory Board for their review and further recommendation to this Board.

The Board met with Douglas County Ambulance Service Director Ted McFarlane and representatives of "Life Flight", Mr. Tom McGovern, executive director of Saint Joseph Hospital, Kansas City, Missouri, and Dr. Hannes, who is in charge of emergency services for that hospital. These gentlemen were visiting Douglas County to demonstrate the equipment which the service operates and to describe the service in detail to the Board and other interested par-'ties in the hope that we might eventually execute a mutual aid agreement with their organization which would then allow them to enter Douglas County, under limited circumstances, to provide their services to the citizens.
