 - c. Hubguard Repair
 - d. Sidewalk Repair
- 2.5 Traffic Line Markings
 - a. Center Line (and no passing)
 - b. Lane Lines
 - c. Edge Line
 - d. Railroad Advance Warning Markings
- 2.6 Traffic Control Signing

The City of Lecompton by this agreement shall be responsible for maintenance of the following on all city connecting links covered by this agreement:

- 3.1 Frontage Roads
- 3.2 Lighting Systems and Traffic Lights
- 3.3 Mowing and Landscape Maintenance
- 3.4 Trash and Litter Pickup - Street Sweeping
- 3.5 Traffic Markings other than Traffic Line Markings
- 3.6 Sidewalks and Entrances
- 3.7 Encroachment Control - Billboards, etc.
- 3.8 Street Name Signs
- 3.9 Storm Sewer Systems
- 3.10 Parking Lanes and Parking Cutbacks
- 3.11 Curb and Gutter Maintenance
- 3.12 School Zone and Crosswalk Signing

The Board met with Fremont Hornberger, maintenance supervisor, to discuss the parking situation in the lot south of the judicial and law enforcement center and in the smaller lot between the judicial and law enforcement center and the courthouse as we prepare to move back into the old courthouse. After lengthy discussion it was agreed by the Board that the parking lot between the judicial and law enforcement center and the courthouse shall be made available for visitors parking only, including two spaces specifically reserved for handicapped persons. The area along the north side of North Park Street between Rhode Island and Massachusetts Street, where parking is permitted, shall allow visitors parking only and be so marked, and in addition, in the parking lot immediately south of the judicial and law enforcement center, the northwest section and north central section of this parking area shall be reserved for visitors only and be so marked.
