Dixie Womack, Senior Service Consultant with Southwestern Bell, appeared before the Board to recommend the purchase and installation of ten additional trunks for the dimension telephone system and five circuit packs which will Ruchased ustall be required as a portion of this installation. The equipment will be charged 10 trunks 1 5 for as follows:

\$1,500 of this figure is the one month contract rate for the five circuit packs.

It is intended that these charges both monthly and for purchase of equipment and installation shall be split 60% to the City of Lawrence and 40% to Douglas County with the County's share of the one month contract to be paid from revenue sharing funds. This arrangement is subject to final approval of the City of Lawrence. After discussion and review it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that we move forward with the purchase of the ten trunks and the five circuit packs and execute the contract between Southwestern Bell and Douglas County for this purpose, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.

The Board noted receipt of a correspondence from Raymond E. Olson, Engineer of Secondary Roads, which indicates that bids have been accepted by the state on Project 23 RS 1347 (7) which is the Kanwaka Corner west project. The two low bids are as follows: N. R. Hamm Contractor, Inc., for grading, in the amount of \$436,053 and Frisbie Bridge Company, Inc., Bridge at Sta. 367+30, in the amount of \$121,196. The letter indicates that the county matching fund amount will be \$183,926 and that it is expected that the remittance should be made on or before February 5, 1979.
