Mr. McGee then presented a utility agreement on Bridge Project No. 10.90N-16.45E between Southwestern Bell Telephone Company and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County which agreement relates to provisions of K.S.A. 17-1901 as to the necessity for movement of utility equipment and facilities which are located on county right-of-way. The agreement indicates that relocation of existing facilities which are currently located on private easement will be paid for by Douglas County and that those facilities within county right-of-way will be moved at utility company expense, and that the construction or alterations of the company's facilities shall be completed within thirty days after the county furnishes to the company the required information. After review of this agreement it was moved by Mr. Neis that this utility agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

At the hour of 10:00 a.m., the Board heard an item from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission meeting of January 24, 1979. Planning Director Roger Hedrick and Linda Finger, staff member, appeared before the Board to present Item No. 7 from the agenda of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission meeting which item is a request to rezone from A (Agricultural) to B-2 (General Business) approximately 3.78 acres generally described as being located on the south side of U.S. Highway 40, approximately 1,500 feet west of County Road 1025, submitted by Homer Fickel. The item comes forward to this Board from the Planning Commission with a recommendation for denial of the rezoning request. A lengthy discussion was held giving the applicant, his attorney, and other interested parties ample time to present their views on this matter. After discussion was concluded it was moved by Mr. Neis that based on the evidence before the Board that the Board deny the applicant the rezoning reclassification asked for, for the reasons stated in the staff report. Motion was seconded by Mr. Cragan. Mrs. Bradley asked that all in favor of this motion say "aye". Mr. Neis, Mr. Cragan, and Mrs. Bradley all answered "aye". Motion carried unanimously. A record of the entire proceedings was taken by a certified court reporter.
