Jim Williams, architect with Peters, Williams & Kubota, appeared before the Board accompanied by Fremont Hornberger, maintenance supervisor, to discuss the water problem in the basement of the Douglas County Courthouse. Mr. Williams recommended that the following steps be taken as a relatively inexpensive potential remedy (compared to other alternatives):

- Have the sod stripped back for approximately five foot width around 1. the perimeter of the building.
- 2. Have a relatively "clay-ey", workable soil hauled in, placed up against, sloped away from the building for a 4 ft. width, 6"-8" thick.
- 3. Have the sod re-placed over the compacted, sloped area, and wateredin.
- 4. Extend roof down spouts away from the building with heavy galvanized metal onto splash blocks placed approximately 4 ft. from the building.

5. Follow items 1, 2 and 3 in eliminating any low spots which may exist away from the building.

After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that the recommendation of Mr.

Williams be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously. Dr. Alan R. Johnson, Director of Headquarters, Inc., appeared before the Board to present a GCCA application entitled "Douglas County Youth Emergency D.C.C.A. Capp Shelter" in the amount of \$91,489.36. The duration of this grant is from July 1, 1979 to June 30, 1980. It is pointed out that the source of funds will all be federal funds and that Douglas County's involvement in this grant application is purely to serve as administrator and to provide no funds. Af-Youth Shelte ter complete review it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this application be approved for submission with the understanding that Douglas County is to provide no funds, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.
