The Board considered Resolution No. 79-13 which resolution relates to granting a cereal malt beverage license to Floyd E. Pulse, for use at Floyd's Bait & Tackle, Route 5, Lawrence, Kansas. It was moved by Mr. Neis that this resolution be adopted, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Used Deptier Recommend the acceptance of a contract entitled Agreement to Treat Noxious Reque with ATTSF Weeds between Douglas County and AT&SF Railroad. This contract indicates that Douglas County will treat the AT&SF right-of-way for removal of noxious weeds to tread R/ω Bob Duver, Douglas County noxious weed director, appeared before the Board to using the following cost per hour figures: Equipment rental \$6.00, labor cost \$5.00, and \$4.00 for each additional man required on this job. It is agreed by the terms of this contract that AT&SF will pay Douglas County an amount for this service not to exceed \$800 for the Calendar Year 1979. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this contract be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.

Reconnelineard: Fremont Hornberger, maintenance supervisor, appeared before the Board to re-debent Ruff employed as a janitor at Val leyview Care Home, to the Douglas County maintenance department. Mr. Hornquest the transfer of Robert J. Ruff, presently employed as a janitor at Valleyview Care Home, to the Douglas County maintenance department. Mr. Hornberger requested that Mr. Ruff be employed in the position of custodian to work in the Douglas County Courthouse and the Douglas County Judicial and Law Enforcement Center and that the salary be changed from \$2.90 per hour to \$525 per month, effective April 3, 1979. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this request be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, appeared before the Board to present the First Quarter Report for 1979 of the transactions which have taken place in his department. Mr. Kellum indicated the issuance of fifteen building permits for new homes or additions to residences with a total declared value to be \$512,100. Permits were issued for two mobile homes for \$25,000. The total estimated value for the three months period is \$537,100 and the total fees collected by his department is \$587.50. This figure compares to a First Quarter Report of 1978 of a total estimated value of \$1,291,900. A copy of this First Quarter Report will be on file in the commission office.

Austriance, opp. Phil Leonard, risk management administrator, appeared before the Board to dis-Company acception the results of the bid opening for Douglas County Workers' Compensation Insurance. Mr. Leonard recommended that the Board accept the bid received for Workemen's from Continental Casualty Company submitted through Landreth, McGrew & Johnson in the amount of \$38,732 to be effective April 1, 1979 for a period of one year. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that the Board accept the bid of Continental Casualty Company (C.N.A.) in the amount of \$38,732, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
