By this document it is resolved that as of July 1, 1979, and until otherwise determined by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, twenty cents per mile shall be allowed to county officials and employees for each mile actually and necessarily travelled by use of the most direct route by privately owned conveyance for official purposes. No claim shall be presented for mileage travelled as a passenger in a privately owned conveyance in which the mileage allowance is claimed by the owner or operator. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this resolution be adopted, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

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
