Notice of intent to  
issue bonds for  
Clinton Parkway

The Board noted receipt from Charles Stough, bond attorney, of prepared Resolution No. 79-33 which resolution relates to notice of intent to issue bonds for the improvement of Clinton Parkway, also described as County Road No. 702, a County primary arterial highway extending easterly from Clinton Lake Access Road "A" approximately 4.1 miles to a junction at 23rd and Iowa Streets, in the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, under the authority of K.S.A. 68-580 through 585 inclusive, and Article 3, of Chapter 10, of Kansas Statutes Annotated. The maximum amount of such bonds calculated on the assessed tangible valuation of the County as of October 29, 1979, is approximately \$950,000.00. The resolution further states that the funds received for this proposed issue of bonds shall be used in conjunction with funds furnished by the Federal Government, State of Kansas, and the City of Lawrence, Kansas, pursuant to agreement entered into with all of said governmental entities. Following review of the resolution it was moved by Mr. Neis that Resolution No. 79-33 be hereby adopted, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried.
