Mr. Hornberger and Mr. Coleman both recommended that the Board accept the low quote of L. O. McCurry Company, Inc., Grain Valley, Missouri, in the total amount of \$39,006. Melba DeShazo, chief clerk in the public works department, appeared before the Board and presented a contract for right-of-way for Bridge No. 02.01N-11.00E between the Board of Commissioners and Douglas County State Bank, a Kansas Corporation, 9th & Kentucky St., Lawrence, Kansas, for purchase of 0.35 acres of right-of-way, 0.114 acres of temporary easement for borrow channel improvement, 32 rods barb fence and 15 rods temporary fencing in the lump sum of \$427.36. After review it was moved by Mr. Neis that this contract be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Ms. DeShazo then presented a utility agreement on Bridge Project No. 06.00N-00.49E between Kaw Valley Electric Cooperative Co., Inc., and the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County which agreement relates to provisions of K.S.A. 17-1901 as to the necessity for movement of utility equipment and facilities which are located on county right-of-way. The agreement indicates that relocation of existing facilities which are currently located on private easements will be paid for by Douglas County, and that the construction or alterations of the company's facilities shall be completed within fifteen days after the county furnishes to the company the required information. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this utility agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Works

Mike Dooley, public works director, and Travis Brann, emergency preparedness coordinator, appeared before the Board with a recommendation that Rita Fulks be transferred to the public works department on a full time basis and that the emergency preparedness office recruit a replacement for her part time position. This change is to become effective as soon as possible but in no case later than May 10, 1980. It was further recommended that since Ms. Fulks will be eligible for a cost-of-living pay raise in accordance with her part time employment as a state employee in the office of emergency preparedness, that the public works department will increase her pay in accordance with the state cost-of-living schedule July 1, 1980. This action is considered desirable to prevent Ms. Fulks from suffering a decrease in salary as a result of this transfer. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
