County Planning Commission minutes of April 23, 1980. This item is a final plat of Clinton Cove Subdivision No. 2, a small commercial subdivision, located on the west side of the Corps of Engineers Road to Clinton Reservoir. The property lies to the north of the Corps of Engineers property designated as a state park and was submitted by Mrs. William J. Brink. This item comes to the Board with a recommendation of unanimous approval from the Planning Commission. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this final plat be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.

The next item considered by the Board was Item No. 9 from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of April 23, 1980. This item is a request from Arnold D. and Bertha E. Morgison to rezone from A (Agriculture) to I-2 (Light Industrial) approximately 4.17 acres. The property is generally described as being an eighth to one quarter mile north of Midland Road on the east side of County Road 1051. This item comes to the Board with a recommendation for approval, subject to the following conditions:

(1) The modification being that the rezoning be to I-1 (Limited Industrial) rather than I-2 (Light Industrial); and

(2) That the property be platted and filed with the Register of Deeds Office before the rezoning takes effect.

After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that the Board concur in the recommendation of the Planning Commission, subject to the above described conditions, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

The next item for consideration by the Board was Item No. 13 from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of April 23, 1980, which item is an Annual Review of Clinton Reservoir Mini-Comprehensive Plan. After review by David Guntert, it was moved by Mr. Neis that the Board finds the Clinton Reservoir Mini-Comprehensive Plan to be a current and valid document on which to base planning decisions, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

At 11:00 a.m., as advertised, the Board opened sealed bids for the sale of a 1975 Chevrolet truck chassis which has been used by the Douglas County Ambulance Service. Four bids were received. The high bid received was from Katzfey Construction Company, Lawrence, in the amount of \$2325. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that the Board accept the high bid of Katzfey Construction Company, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Thursday, May 15, 1980.
