Report

Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, appeared before the Board to present the Third Quarter Report for 1980 of the transactions which have taken place in his department. Mr. Kellum indicated the issuance of twenty-five building permits for new homes or additions to residences with a total declared value to be \$856,275. Permits were issued for five mobile homes with a total declared value of \$50,000 and one commercial for a total declared value of \$25,000. The total estimated value for the three months period is \$931,275 and the total fees collected by his department is \$545. This figure compares to a Third Quarter Report of 1979 of a total estimated value of \$1,304,950. A copy of this Third Quarter Report will be on file in the commission office.
