Douglas County intends to improve a portion of FAS Route 214 described as follows: Beginning at a point 1200.00 feet East of the N.W. corner of the N.E. 4 of S. 6, T. 12S, R. 18 E.; thence Easterly along the center line of F.A.S. Route 214 a distance of 2.916 miles to a point on the center line of Woodson Avenue in the City of Lecompton, Kansas, said point begin 220.7 feet West of the center line of Whitfield Street. Southwestern Bell Telephone Company will maintain, adjust or construct its facilities which are to occupy highway right-of-way as shown by plans for the above numbered project. Relocation of existing facilities, which are currently located on public right-of-way easement will be paid for by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this Agreement be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
