Mr. Dooley stated that his department has made every effort to settle this matter with the landowner, but no reasonable settlement was attainable. After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Rub. Works' Pusch Mr. Dooley then recommended that we purchase paint supplies from the Kansas Correctional Industries for marking roads under federal aid Project 23C 0344-01. Cost of these supplies is \$7515.40, all of which is 100% reimbursable. By purchasing from Kansas Correctional Índustries, the materials may be accepted on certification and no delay or fee for inspection will be incurred. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this recommendation be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

> Mr. Dooley then presented the Board a contract for right-of-way for Project No. F.A.S. 23-RS-1084(3), between the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County and William J. Smith, a single person, Lecompton, Kansas, for 0.88 acres of right-of-way easement and 25 rods of woven fence, in the lump sum of \$3072. This lump sum payment includes allowance for irregularity of fencing, irregularity of boundary, loss of eight very large hedge trees, proximity of road to dwelling, and abstracting. After review of this contract it was moved by Mr. Cragan that it be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

Council on Aging Alex Conchola, director of the Douglas County Planning Council on Services for the Aging, appeared before the Board to request a shift of funding of health screening clinics for the county's older residents for the coming fiscal year from the council on aging to the Douglas County Health Department Kay Kent, director of the health department, stated that with federal fund cuts in the offing, that the health department couldn't possibly add the health screening clinic to its budget. Marnie Argersinger, a member of the council's finance committee, stated that the agency is faced with such tight finances that it may be making cuts in all programs not federally mandated by the Older Americans Act. The Board directed the council officials to review their 1981 budget again and try to trim it in other areas.
