Also in attendance was Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator. The Board first considered Item No. 6 from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of February 25, 1981. This item is CUP-1-1-81 which is a request for a Conditional Use Permit to conduct farm implement repair and service on a farm in the southwest corner of Douglas County. The property is located approximately two miles south of Globe on County Road 1029 and one-half mile west along Marion Township Road 315 (north side of the road). The property is legally described as the west 1/2 of the southwest 1/4 of Section 10-15-18, initiated by the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission for Austa and Donald Forth. This item comes to the Board with a recommendation of unanimous approval from the Planning Commission, subject to the following conditions:

(1) That the site plan meets conditions of Section 19A; and,

(2) That the C.U.P. be reviewed after the first year of operation.

After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that the Board concur in the recommendation of the Planning Commission, subject to the above described conditions, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.
