Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, appeared before the Board to recommend the approval of Resolution No. 81-15. By this document it is unanimously resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County that under the "Zoning Regulations for the Unincorporated Territory of Douglas County, Kansas," the following shall be amended and adopted: Amend Article 19, Section 19-4.17.b. 1., and Article 3, Section 3-1.55 which address existing mobile homes and mobile home parks. After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that this resolution be approved and published in accordance with the requirements of the law, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Ernest Coleman, federal funds consultant, appeared before the Board to recommend the acceptance of two revenue sharing contracts from the 1981 allocation as follows:

Phone Buried cable Mike Dooley, public works director, appeared before the Board and presented an Application from United Telephone Company of Kansas, Inc., Junction City, Kansas, seeking authority to construct a 6-pair buried telephone cable on F.A.S. Route 1375, Section 22, Township 14, Range 19, in Douglas County, Kansas. This Application has been thoroughly reviewed by the public works department and its approval is recommended to the Board by Mr. Dooley. After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that it be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Temp. easement

Mr. Dooley then presented the Board a Contract for Temporary Easement between William J. Smith, Lecompton, Kansas, and the Board of County Commissioners, Douglas County, Kansas. This contract gives permission for the county to enter upon the property of Mr. Smith for the purpose of removing and depositing eight large hedge trees for the use of Mr. Smith in connection with Douglas County Project No. 23-RS-1084(3). After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this Contract for Temporary Easement be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

The Board noted receipt of application for cereal malt beverage license from Barbara J. Hallar for use at Country Corners, Inc., Highway 40 & Stull Road, Route 1, Lawrence, Kansas. The application was signed and remitted to the Kanwaka Township Board.

Ernest Coleman, federal funds consultant, Judy Culley and Kent Noble appeared before the Board to request that legal publications be made of a notice to bidders requesting sealed bids for specified furnishings and equipment and also remodeling of a Temporary Care Facility located at 4th and Missouri Streets, Lawrence, Kansas, as a result of a grant to be administrated by O'Connell Youth Ranch, Douglas County Court Services, and Volunteers in Court The notice indicates that sealed bids for specified furnishings and equipment and remodeling will be received at the office of the Douglas County Commission until April 6, 1981, at 10:00 a.m., at which time these bid proposals will be publicly opened and read. It is recommended that legal notice be published on March 22 and March 29, 1981. After review of these recommendations it was moved by Mrs. Bradley that these notices be so published, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Mike Dooley, Sheriff Rex Johnson, and members of the Extension County Beauti-Discuss Track being fication Committee appeared before the Board to discuss the dumping of old dumped on Co. Nearly refrigerators, bed mattresses, trees and limbs, bags of trash, etc., along the county roads in Douglas County. The Extension County Beautification Committee recommended when the new landfill is open, that longer hours on Saturday and/or Sunday be observed, and perhaps even a period on one day of the week in which free dumping would be available to those people wishing to dump certain items brought to the landfill in their own vehicles, and also to include more dump sites throughout the county (trash containers).
