Yankee Tank

Charles Stough, bond attorney for Douglas County, appeared before the Board and presented Resolution No. 81-22 which is a resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, sitting as the governing body of Yankee Tank Main Sewer District No. 2, determining and apportioning the costs of certain sewer improvements within said District. The construction of the Main Trunk Sewer improvements within Yankee Tank Main Sewer District No. 2 has been completed according to the contract, plans and specifications, and said project has been accepted by the Chief Engineer and Director of Public Works of Yankee Tank Main Sewer District No. 2, and by this Board as the governing body of said Main Sewer District. The Board of County Commissioners has determined the costs of said sewer improvements and has determined the apportionment to be made to the various tracts, lots or parcels of land within said Main Sewer District in the manner provided by law and particularly K.S.A. 19-2704A, et seq., and all acts supplemental or amendatory thereto. It was moved by Mrs. Bradley that the cost of said improvements now constructed within said Main Sewer District shall be apportioned to the various tracts or parcels of land within the boundaries of said District as said boundaries have been heretofore determined by said Governing Body, which boundaries are hereby confirmed, and that the full cost of said improvements be, and the same is hereby, determined and fixed at Six Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$610,000.00) and that said cost be, and the same is hereby, apportioned on all lots or parcels of land contained within the boundaries of said Main Sewer District equally per acre or square foot, computed on the basis of net area exclusive of streets, roads, cemeteries or public parks, and that the amounts so levied and assessed against the respective pieces of land within said Main Sewer District are respectively the amounts set opposite the several tracts of land in the table of assessments as set out in the schedule thereof now filed in this project and incorporated in this resolution by reference as if fully set out herein. Motion seconded by Mr. Cragan and carried unanimously.
