Motion seconded by Mrs. Bradley and carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mrs. Bradley that the low bid on renovation submitted by Philip J. Entz, 3204 West 24th Terrace, Lawrence, Kansas, in the partial amount of \$10,000 be approved and the balance of \$3674 is to be submitted as a special construction request to the appropriate office in Washington, D.C. for their approval. Upon written approval, the balance of \$3674 will be added to this contract. This amount covers the supplying and installation of bathroom fixtures, 80-gallon hot water heater, new kitchen cabinets, exterior fencing, certain new wiring, light fixtures and heat detection system. It is understood that construction funds require 50% local match and this is to be covered by the supplying and installation of a quality fire escape (value of approximately \$4000) by local efforts without county funds involved. Motion seconded by Mr. Cragan and carried unanimously.

The Board considered a document titled Authority to Award Contract Commitment of County Funds on Project No. 23 C 1245-01 (Formerly BRS 509 (11)), which document indicates that a low bid received on the above project was from Taylor Construction Company, Inc., Lenexa, Kansas, in the amount of \$205,846.50 for bridge repair Br. Sta. 19+04, and that county funds on this project is \$45,287 which funds are hereby pledged to be remitted to the State of Kansas on or before June 1, 1981. By this document the Board resolves that we find the bid described above to be acceptable and that the Secretary of Transportation is hereby authorized to award the necessary contracts for the completion of the work on this project as was bid. After review it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this Authority to Award Contract Commitment of County Funds be executed and forwarded to the Secretary of Transportation, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.
