Hearing - Babe in
the Woods closed
for 5 days for
violation

At 9:00 a.m., District Attorney Mike Malone appeared before the Board for a hearing in the matter of Susan D. Matney, d/b/a J.B. (Babe in the Woods) Tavern, Route 4, Lawrence, Kansas. The complaint states that on or about the 3rd day of February, 1982, in the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, Susan D. Matney, licensee, d/b/a J.B. (Babe in the Woods) Tavern, then and there being, did unknowingly or knowingly employ a person who had been adjudged guilty of a felony, all in violation of K.S.A. 41-2708(j). Susan D. Matney was present for the hearing without counsel. The Babe in the Woods establishment is located at the junction of Highways 24-40 and 32. Mr. Malone stated that the burden of proof is entirely on the person who is doing the hiring and the state forbids hiring convicted felons either knowingly or unknowingly. The former employee was convicted in federal court in 1973 for a violation stemming from a forgery charge. Mr. Malone stated that those places licensed by the county to sell 3.2 beer come under his jurisdiction. At 9:05 a.m. it was moved by Mr. Neis and seconded by Mr. Cragan that the Board adjourn to go into executive session to discuss this matter with Mike Malone. Motion carried. The Board resumed regular session at 9:09 a.m. After the executive session the Board suspended the license for Babe in the Woods for five consecutive days with the agreement that the Board be notified in advance of the exact dates the bar will close. The Board will then notify the Sheriff's Office of these five days. These five consecutive days are to be observed before the end of April 1982.

The Board noted receipt of a letter from the State of Kansas Energy Office, Topeka, Kansas, dated March 12, 1982, stating that the federal grant proposal submitted by the Council on Community Services of Douglas County, Inc., entitled "Transit Energy Conservation Project" in the total amount of \$24,903.79 has been denied. The Board approved this grant application on February 10, 1982, purely as sponsor and fiscal agent.
