Mr. Dooley appeared before the Board with Resolution No. 82-18 which resolution states that the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, having received a request to vacate a part of Road No. 51-G on the 15th day of April 1982, submitted by Stanley R. Zaremba, and containing the signature of Edward Eckman, adjoining landowner, and whereas notice of hearing has been given as provided in K.S.A. 68-102a and upon said hearing there have been no Objections to vacating said road(s), and whereas, the Board unanimously finds that it would be to the best interests of Douglas County, Kansas, to vacate part of Road No. 51-G as provided in K.S.A. 68-102, described as all of that portion located in the Northwest Quarter (N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$) lying East of a line 33 feet of and parallel to the West line of said Northwest Quarter (N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$) and all portions located in the Southwest Quarter $(S.W.\frac{1}{4})$, all in Section 8, Township 14 South, Range 20 East. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this resolution be approved, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously. It should be noted that at 10:00 a.m., May 12, 1982, as advertised, the Board had a hearing on this matter and the Board deferred action until receiving concurrence from the Palmyra Township Board and this concurrence has now been received.

Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator, presented the Board Resolution No. 82-19. By this document it is unanimously resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County that under the "Zoning Regulations for the Unincorporated Territory of Douglas County, Kansas," the following changes in zoning classification be made: Zoning classification is changed from A-1 (Suburban Home Residential) to B-3 (Limited Business District) on a recorded subdivision plat described as the Lake Estates Subdivision No. 1. Also, zoning classification is changed from A-1 (Suburban Home Residential) to B-1 (Neighborhood Business District) on recorded subdivision plat described as the Lake Estates Subdivision No. 2. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this resolution be approved and published in accordance with the requirements of the law, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Glen Snesrud, representing the Boy Scouts plus two other individuals, ap-

peared before the Board to discuss using BB guns at the Douglas County 4-H Fairgrounds during the Boy Scouts Day Camp to be held in July 1982 at the fairgrounds. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this matter be taken under advisement, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.

Later the Board again discussed the Boy Scouts using BB guns at the fairgrounds. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that the Board inform Glen Snesrud that the Board will allow him to conduct the BB gun target range shooting and safety instruction at the fairgrounds with the following stipulations: (1) This course is part of a Boy Scouts supervised program, (2) the guns are to be chained to the instruction area and not carried throughout the fairgrounds, (3) no individually owned guns will be allowed on the fairgrounds premises, and (4) BB guns will be fired only during a time of organized instruction. This permission is considered to be a one time, trial basis situation, and does not constitute a blanket approval of use of BB guns at the fairgrounds. Motion seconded by Mr. Cragan and carried unanimously.

Rig. Devel; : Repair, died books

Sue Neustifter, register of deeds, appeared before the Board to recommend that three of the old deed books be repaired by the United Binding Company, St. Paul, Minnesota, in the amount of \$1761.90. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that this recommendation be approved and paid from the Revenue Sharing Contingency Fund, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
