After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan that this statement be approved and paid from revenue sharing funds, seconded by Mr. Neis, and carried unanimously.

Res. 82-23 Bords for new ambulance bldg The Board noted receipt from bond attorney Charles Stough of prepared Resolution No. 82-23 which resolution authorizes the issuance of temporary notes numbered 1 and 2, Series August 1, 1982, aggregating the principal amount of \$100,000 for the purpose of providing funds with which to pay for the obligations of the County for costs incurred and immediately accruing to construct and equip a public building to be used as an ambulance facility, pursuant to K.S.A. 15,144 et seq., as amended. Following review of the resolution it was moved by Mr. Neis that Resolution No. 82-23 be hereby adopted, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Dispersonnel D. Murphy Res. 82-24 At 10:54 a.m. it was moved by Mr. Neis and seconded by Mr. Cragan that the Board adjourn to go into executive session with Dallas Murphy, undersheriff, to discuss personnel matters. Motion carried. The Board resumed regular session at 11:16 a.m.

Dan Young, county counselor, presented the Board Resolution No. 82-24 which resolution pursuant to K.S.A. 19-15, 114 et seq. authorizes the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, to create a special building fund of \$250,000 by an annual tax levy of .250 mills upon all taxable tangible property in Douglas County, said levy to be made initially by the 1983 budget and to continue for a total of five years. The specific purpose for which the special building fund is created is to provide necessary office relocations, improvements, repairs and improvements to the existing Courthouse and the Judicial and Law Enforcement Center buildings as set forth in the recitals hereof, such improvements and repairs to include, but not by way of limitation, changing of partitions, furnishings, carpeting, telephone, radio transmission equipment, and data processing systems. After complete review of this resolution it was moved by Mr. Neis that Resolution No. 82-24 be adopted, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.
