Roclamation in Wiabetes Ed. month

The Board considered a Proclamation declaring the month of November as "Lions Diabetes Education Month". After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Hiebert that this Proclamation be approved, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.

At the hour of 10:00 a.m., the Board discussed a planning item with David Guntert, staff member of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Department, and Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator. The Board considered Item No. 10 from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of October 26, 1983. This item is to consider text amendments to variance provisions of subdivision regulations. This item comes to the Board with a recommendation for approval as follows:

21-802 VARIANCES. In cases where there is hardship in carrying out the literal provisions of the regulations (such as design criteria pertaining to lot width, lot depth, block depth, etc.) the Planning Commission may grant a variance from such provisions, except that in cases where there is hardship in carrying out the literal provisions found in Section 21-705 (sanitary sewers) the appropriate governing body may grant a variance from such provisions.

(1) An application for a variance shall be made to the planning department. The Planning Commission shall give the applicant and any other interested persons an opportunity to be heard with respect to the proposed application for a variance from the provisions of the regulations, except that the governing body shall give the applicant and any other interested persons an opportunity to be heard with respect to the proposed application for a variance from the provisions of Section 21-705.

- A variance shall not be granted unless all of the following (2) apply:
  - (1) Strict application of these regulations will create an undue hardship upon the subdivider;
  - The proposed variance is in harmony with the intended (2) purpose of these regulations; and,
  - (3) The public health, safety and welfare will be protected.

After discussion it was moved by Mrs. Hiebert that the Board concur in the recommendation of the planning commission, seconded by Mrs. Bradley, and carried unanimously.
