The Board discussed planning items with David Guntert, staff member of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Department. Also present was Wayne Kellum, zoning administrator. The Board considered Item No. 11B from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of April 25, 1984. This item is a final plat of SEAS Subdivision, a 16 lot subdivision containing approximately 54.87 acres. The property is located north of Clinton Reservoir (approximately 2.5 miles west of Lawrence) on the east side of Kanwaka Township Road #65, submitted by Evans, Bierly, Hutchison and Associates for Property Development Company, Inc. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Neis that the Board accept the rights-of-way and approve the easements, seconded by Mrs. Hiebert, and carried unanimously.

The Board then considered Item No. 11C(1) from the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission minutes of April 25, 1984. This item is a request to rezone from A (Agriculture) to A-1 (Suburban Home Residential) approximately 5 acres in Douglas County, Kansas. The property is located approximately 3 miles south of Lawrence (along U.S. Highway 59) and one mile west of Wakarusa Township Road #240, submitted by Peters, Kubota and Glenn for Joan Peak. This item comes to the Board with a 5-3 recommendation for approval from the planning commission.
