

Whereas John Noyes a resident of
Douglas County State of Kansas did sue
or about the 10th day of March A.D. 1873
duly apply to the undersigned fence viewers
of Waukauas Township in said County
to view and appraise the partition fence
described as follows to wit Beginning
at the North west corner of Section 36,
in Township 12 of Range 19 and running
South between Section 36. and 35 about
Seventy Seven rods on the line between
the land of said Noyes and that of
Patrick Nugan. And whereas said fence
viewers did set the 21st day of March for
viewing and appraising said fence at
9. O'clock A.M. of said day and it being
proven to us that said Nugan had
been duly notified of the time and place
of said view and whereas we did on said
21st day of March duly assemble on said
premises and then and there proceed to view
and appraise said fence and to designate
which portion of said fence the said
John Noyes should build and maintain
and after carefully examining said fence
we do appraise the value of said fence on
said line at the sum of Thirty Seven & ²⁵/₁₀₀
dollars. And we do partition the said line
of fence as follows to wit We set off and
direct that John Noyes do build and
maintain Forty rods of the south end of
said line of fence. And we set off and
direct that the said Patrick Nugan build
and maintain the fence on the rest of said
line being about Thirty five rods of the
north end.
