

and that the complainant L. N. Snider appeared in person and who was duly examined and the said Mrs S. R. Bell appeared by her agent and husband H. S. Bell who was duly examined. Whereupon it is considered agreed and adjudged by us that the value of said entire fence partition fence is \$104.00 and that the amount said adjoining land Mrs S. R. Bell pay to the said Snider the one half thereof to wit the sum of \$52.00 fifty two Dollars.

We further find on actual view of said fence and on said application for assignment and service that said fence along the entire line thereof should be kept in repair by said parties in equal shares and assign and let apart the North half thereof to said L. N. Snider being 80 rods more or less commencing at the north end thereof and to the center and let apart the South half thereof to said Mrs S. R. Bell being 80 rods more or less commencing at the South end thereof and to the center Each to be by them kept up and maintained at their several proper and personal expenses and that the costs of this proceeding taxed at \$7.25 be adjudged to be paid by the said Mrs S. R. Bell To all of which findings and arguments we have this day set our hands this 10th day of August A.D. 1878.
