We the undersigned officers of Wakarusa Township and
Fence Viewers in and for said township in Douglas County,
Kansas, met this 16th day of September, A.D. 1897, pursuant
to notice to view the partition fence between the lands of
W. H. Armstrong on the north and Peter Harmon on the south,
being a half a mile of partition fence between the lands
of the above named parties. The land of the said Armstrong
being described as the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ quarter of Section 13, Township
13, Range 19, and the lands of said Harmon being described
as the portion of N.W. quarter North of Wakarusa Creek of Section
24, Township 13, and Range 19, in Wakarusa Township said
County and State.

We the said fence viewers at the request of the said owners
they, being unable to come to any agreement between them-
selves in relation to the division of the partition fence
between them find upon actual view of the premises that
the lands of the said parties are fenced in common and that
there is no lawful partition fence between said lands.

We therefore assign to the said W. H. Armstrong the east
half, being eighty rods of the partition fence between said
land, and to the said Harmon the west half being eighty
rods of the partition fence between said lands; each of
said parties to keep and maintain in good repair his
above share of a lawful fence between the above described
lands.

If posts and barb wire are used, not less than three
wires, with the third wire not less than forty-four inches
from the ground nor more than forty-eight inches;
the bottom wire not more than twenty-four inches nor
less than eighteen inches from the ground with center
wire equi-distant between upper and lower wire;
wires to be securely fastened to posts with posts not
more than one rod apart; said fence to be built
within thirty days from this date.

In witness of which assignment we, the aforesaid
