

Whereas a controversy concerning the division fence between S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ and the S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. T.15 R.20 has been referred to the board of Road viewers of Polymra Twp for settlement:

Whereas the owners of both tracts agree that said fence had been divided by mutual agreement, the north half to the S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ and the south half to S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$.

Whereas James Carpenter, the owner of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ has cut the hedge and removed the fence on a part of the ^{South half and removed the hog wire} S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ from ^{belonging to Julius Smith owner of the} said fence:

Whereas said James Carpenter claims to own the hedge in the north half of said fence: and

Whereas said board has duly viewed said road after due notice to all parties concerned:

Therefore; it is hereby decided:-

(1) The north half of said fence shall be maintained by the owner of said S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ and the south half shall be maintained by the owner of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$

(2) The fence on the north half is in reasonably good condition. Said James Carpenter is ordered to build and maintain a legal fence on the south half to which said Julius Smith can attach his hog wire.

(3) Said Julius Smith is ordered to pay said James Carpenter \$5.00 (five dollars) and to replace his own hog wire on the fence on the south half if he desires it hog tight, in consideration of which
