

Know all men that we the undersigned of the County of Douglas^{and} State of Kansas are held^{and} firmly bound to the State of Kansas in the penal sum of two thousand dollars to be paid to the State of Kansas, for which payment well and truly to be made we do bind ourselves our heirs executors^{and} Administrators firmly by these present sealed with our seals^{and} dated this tenth day of November A.D. 1885.

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas B. J. Horton was duly elected Register of Deeds for said County of Douglas at an election held in said County on the third day of November A.D. 1885:

Now if the said B. J. Horton will faithfully, correctly^{and} impartially perform all the duties of his said office to which he was elected as aforesaid^{and} shall deliver to his successor in office all books, records, maps, deeds mortgages papers and things belonging to his office, then the said obligation shall be void; otherwise to be and remain in full force and effect.
