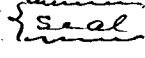
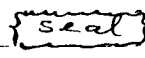
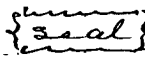


Bond

The conditions of this Obligation are, That whereas the above bounden Joel White was on the Third day of November A.D. 1885 elected to the office of County Clerk in the County of Douglas, Now if the said Joel White shall safely keep all moneys which may be collected or received by him or which may otherwise come into his hands by virtue of this office, and pay the same over to the proper person or authority and shall honestly and faithfully discharge and perform all and singular his duties as County Clerk, according to law, during his continuance in office, then this obligation shall be void otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
