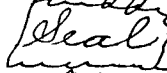
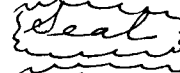

VanHoesen as surities, are held and bound unto the State of Kansas, in the penal sum of Three Thousand (\$3000) Dollars, lawful money of the United States, to the true and lawful payment of which we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators firmly by these presents. Dated Lawrence, Kansas, this 12th day of November, A.D. 1886.

The conditions of this obligation are, That whereas the above bounden John D. A. Norton was, on the second day of November A.D. 1886 elected to the office of Probate Judge of the County of Douglas. Now if the said John D. A. Norton shall faithfully pay and apply all moneys and effects which may be collected or received by him, or which may otherwise come into his hands by virtue of this office, and pay the same over to the proper person or authority, and shall honestly and faithfully discharge and perform all and singular his duties as Probate Judge, according to law, during his continuance in office, then this obligation shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

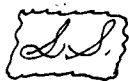
