Now if the said James Brooks will faithfully, correctly and impartially perform all the duties of his said office to which he was elected, as aforesaid, and shall deliver to his successor in office, all books, records, Maps, Deeds, Mortgages, papers and things belonging to his office, then the said obligation shall be void; otherwise to be and remain in full force and effect.
