Sealed with our seals and dated at Lawrence Kansas this 27th day of November A.D. 1889.

The considerations of this obligation are: that whereas the above bounden James Brooks was on the 5th day of November A.D. 1889 duly elected to the office of Register of Deeds of Douglas County Kansas.

Now if the said James Brooks will faithfully, correctly and impartially perform all the duties of his said office to which he was elected as aforesaid, and shall deliver to his successor in office all books, records Maps, Deeds, Mortgages, papers and things belonging to his office, then the said obligation shall be void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and effect.

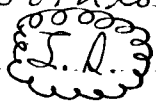
