Horton shall faithfully pay and apply all the moneys and effects which may be collected or received by him, or which may otherwise come into his hands by virtue of this office, and pay the same over to the proper person or authority, and shall honestly and faithfully discharge and perform all and singular his duties as Probate Judge according to law, during his continuance in office, then this obligation shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
