Brooks was, on the 3rd day of Nov^r A.D. 1891, elected to the office of County clerk in the County of Douglas: Now if the said F. D. Brooks shall safely keep all the moneys which may be collected or received by him, or which may otherwise come into his hands by virtue of this office, and shall pay the same over to the proper person or authority, and shall honestly and faithfully discharge and perform all and singular his duties as County clerk according to law during his continuance in office, then this obligation shall be void: otherwise to remain in full force and effect
