Dated at Lawrence Kansas this first day of January A. D. 1900. The conditions of this obligation are, that, whereas the above bounden J. C. Watts was, on the 7th day of November A. D. 1899 elected to the office of County Commissioner in the First Commissioner District County of Douglas; Now if the said J. C. Watts shall safely keep all the money which may be collected or received by him, or which may otherwise come into his hands by virtue of this office, and pay the same over to the proper person or authority, and shall honestly and faithfully discharge and perform all and singular his duties as County Commissioner according to law, during his continuance in office, then this obligation shall be void: otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
