This Indenture made this 24<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty one between the Pastor  
 and Vestry of Trinity Church in the City of Lawrence in the County  
 of Douglas in the State of Kansas of the first part and The College  
 of the Sisters of Bethany in the City of Poplar in the County of Shawnee  
 in the State of Kansas of the second part—

Witnesseth that the parties of the first part in consideration of the  
 sum of Three thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) to them duly paid the receipt  
 whereof is hereby acknowledged have sold and by these presents do grant  
 bargain sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part its  
 successors and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land with  
 the Chapel and buildings erected thereon situate in said City of Lawrence  
 in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas aforesaid described as follows  
 to-wit: Beginning at a point in the westerly line of Vermont Street  
 distant seventy five (75) feet southerly from the south westerly corner of  
 Vermont and Berkeley Streets: and running thence westerly and  
 parallel with said Berkeley Street one hundred and seventeen (117) feet  
 or thereabouts to an alley way thence southerly along said alley  
 way and parallel to said Vermont Street seventy five feet (75)  
 thence easterly and parallel to said Berkeley Street one hundred  
 and seventeen (117) feet or thereabouts to the westerly line of  
 Vermont Street and thence northerly along said westerly line  
 of said Vermont Street seventy five (75) feet to the point or place of  
 beginning: being the southerly one half or twenty five (25) feet of
