

in and conveyed by the said Indenture of November 1st A.D. 1880 unto the said Adams his heirs assigns and successors to and to the use of the said John F. Dillon and the said Edward D Adams their successors and assigns as joint tenants and not as tenants in common for the uses trusts and purposes ^{and all the uses trusts and purposes} set forth in the said indenture of the first day of November 1880. Four thousand bonds have already been issued and certified by the said Dillon but all bonds to be issued under the said indenture after the number four thousand shall be certified according to the terms of the said indenture by the said two trustees, to wit the said Dillon and the said Adams and their successor, or successor and shall not be binding and valid obligations until so certified.

All the other provisions of the said indenture of November 1st 1880 are to be and remain in full force ^{and} virtue.
