Reming his wife of Marion Township, Douglas County, Kansas, of the first part, and Mrs. Augusta Mack of Lawrence, Kansas, of the second ^{party}, Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred and Twenty Four Dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged have granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and by these presents to grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, and to her heirs and assigns forever, of the following described pieces and parcels of land, lying and situate, in the Township of Marion County, Douglas, and State of Kansas to-wit: The West Half of the South East Quarter of Section No. Thirty-Eight and the East Half of the South West Quarter of Section No. Thirty-Five (35) all in Township No. Fourteen (14), South of Range No. Seventeen (17) East of 1st Principal Meridian, containing 160 acres of Land more or less,

To Have and to Hold, the same, with all and singular the appurtenances thereto in anywise belonging unto the party of the second part and to her heirs and assigns forever. And the said parties of the first part do hereby covenant and agree, that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owners of the premises above granted and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein, free and clear of all incumbrances, and that they well warrant and defend the same in the quiet and peaceable possession of the said party of the second part her heirs and assigns forever against all persons lawfully claiming the same.

Provided Always, And these presents are upon this express condition, that whereas, the said John E. Reming is justly indebted unto the said Mrs. Augusta Mack in the principal sum of Five Hundred and Twenty-Four Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America, being for a loan thereof, on the day and date hereof made by the said Mrs. Augusta Mack to the said John E. Reming and secured to be paid by the entire promissory note of the said John E. Reming, bearing even date herewith, payable to the order of
