This Indenture made this 29th day of June AD 1881 between Noah O'Harris of Douglas County in the State of Kansas of the first part and Francis M. Clark of Douglas County in the State of Kansas of the second part.

Witnesseth That said party of the first part in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged does by these presents grant bargain sell and convey unto said party of the second part his heirs and assigns all the following described Real Estate situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas to wit The South One hundred (100) acres of the South West quarter of Section Twenty (20) in Township Thirteen (13) Range Twenty one (21)

To Have and to Hold the same, Together with all and singular the tenements hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining forever.

Provided Always And these presents are upon this express condition that whereas Noah O'Harris has this day executed and delivered his certain promissory note in writing to said party of the second part of which the following is a Copy

500⁰⁰ \$ Edora June 27th 1881

Two years after date I promise to pay to the order of Francis M. Clark Five Hundred Dollars at ten percent interest payable annually

Now if said party of the first part shall fail or cause to be paid to said party of the second part his heirs or assigns said sum of money in the above described note mentioned together with the interest
