

waste, then these presents shall be void and otherwise shall remain in full force and effect. But if any of said notes or any part thereof or any interest therein is not paid when the same is due or if the taxes and assessments of every nature which are or may be assessed and levied against said premises or any part thereof are not paid when the same becomes due and payable then all of said notes and interest therein shall and by these presents do become immediately due and payable if the holder hereof so elects without notice. Said parties of the first part agree to keep the buildings upon said premises insured until all paid notes are paid in a reliable insurance company, for the benefit of the Mortgagee in the sum of at least \$200. and upon failure of said parties of the first part to keep said buildings insured the holder hereof may insure the same and shall be entitled to recover from the parties of the first part the amount paid for such insurance with 12 per cent interest and the same shall be a lien upon said premises, secured by this mortgage. Upon default of the above covenants' conditions or any or either of them the party of the first part his heirs and assigns shall be entitled to the immediate possession of said premises, and to the rents issues and profits of the same.

In case of foreclosure of this mortgage said real estate to be sold with or without appraisement as the holder hereof may elect.
