This Indenture Made this 6th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two between Susan Head and F. C. Head her husband of Decompton in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas of the first part and Laura P. Ginn of Decompton in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas of the second part:

Witnesseth That the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred Dollars to them duly paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part her heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land situate in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas described as follows to wit:

Beginning at a point on the right bank of the Kansas river at a point where the east boundary line of S. W. 1/4 of Section 34 in Town 6N Range 15 intersects the same thence south and with the east boundary line of said quarter Section 34 67 chains and 71 links thence east 4 chains and 20 links thence north 26 chains and 70 links to the right bank of Kansas river thence up the Kansas river to place of beginning containing 30 acres of land with the appurtenances and all the estate title and interest of the said part of the first part therein.
